A White "Sea" Elephant?



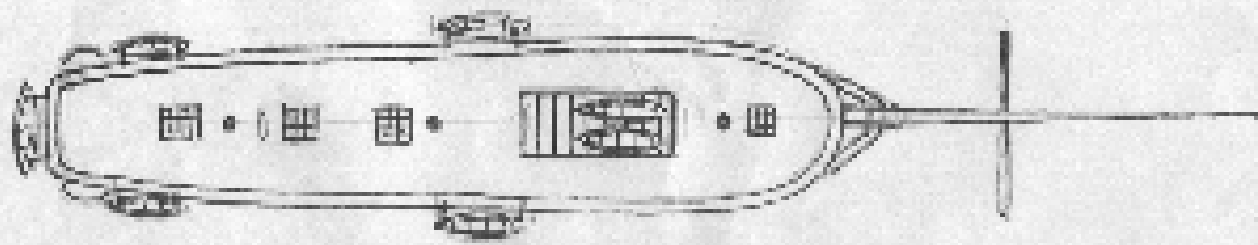
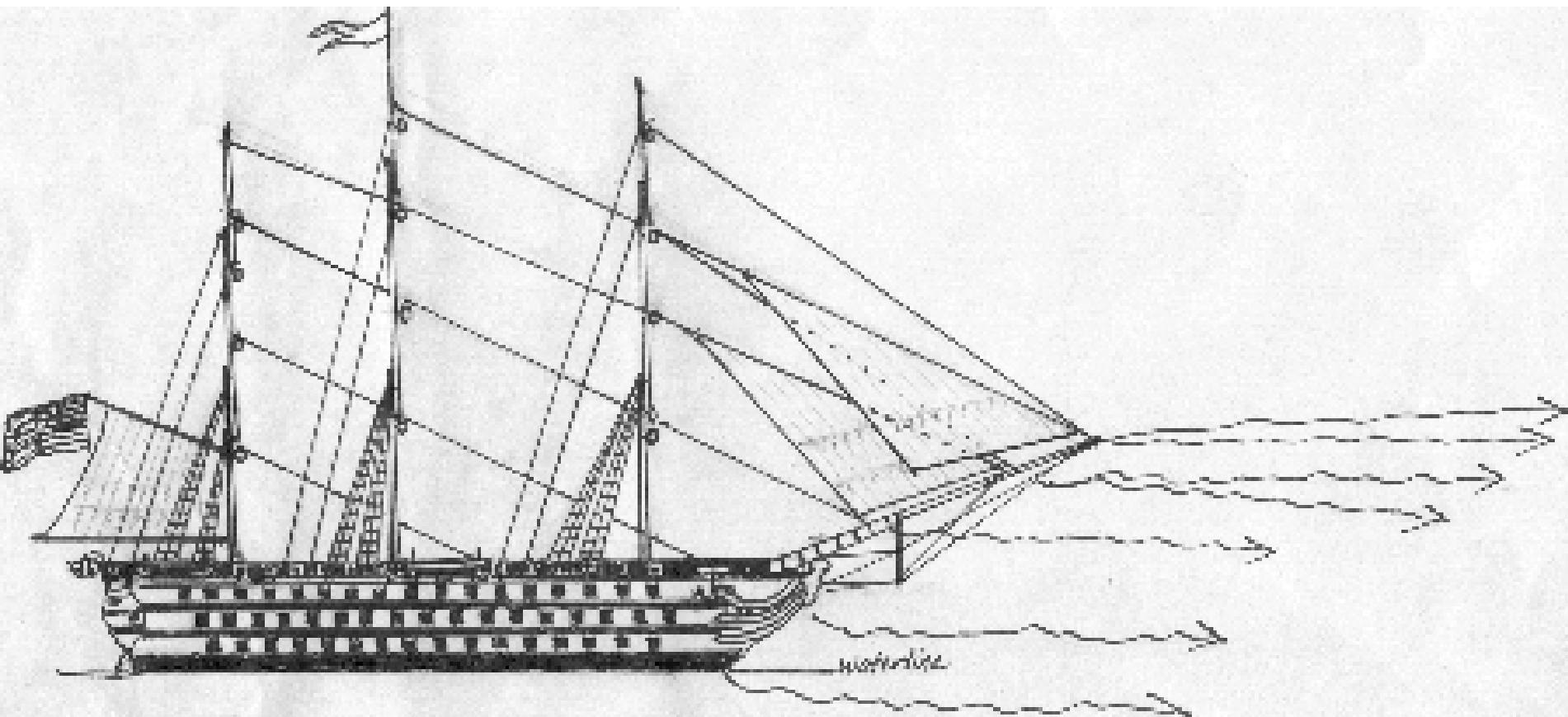
President John Quincy Adams said the 120-gun PENNSYLVANIA, the Navy's largest ship-of-the-line, "looked like a city." But after a fifteen year building period, she made only one voyage — Philadelphia to Hampton Roads. Requiring a crew of 1100 men and boys and too expensive to operate, she became a receiving ship, ultimately to be burned as Federal Forces evacuated the Norfolk Navy Yard in April 1861.

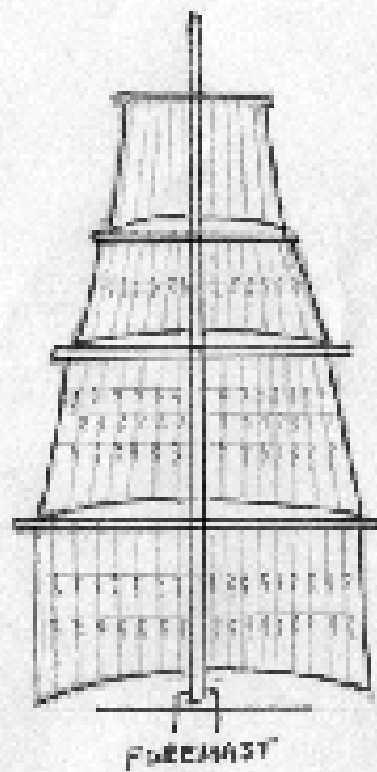
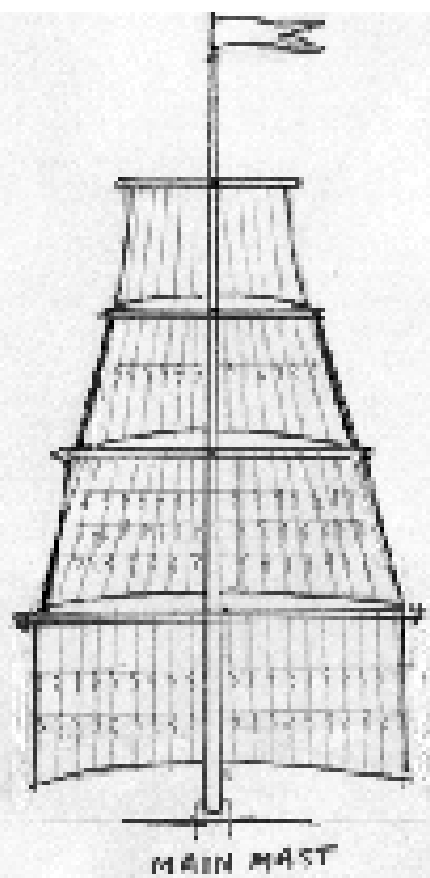
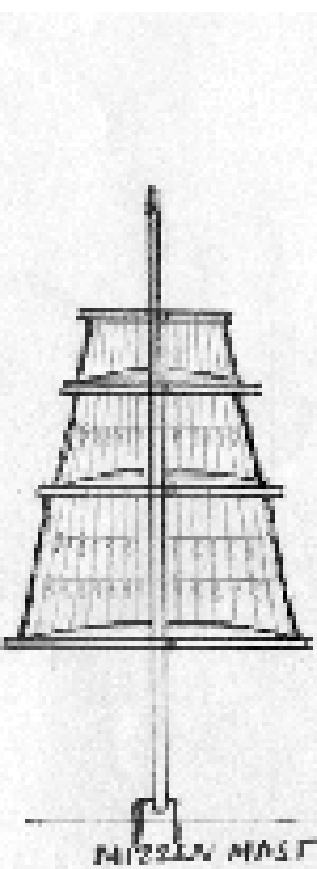
